Welcome everyone. Welcome to the Cross Country Ski Association of Manitoba (CCSAM) Annual General Meeting (AGM) for the 2021-2022 ski season.

The cloud of COVID infections continues to be a present reality. However, there are good news stories from the past ski season. In addition, *I am optimistic for the upcoming ski season in Manitoba.*

Our Events Calendar was a modified success. Ski Lessons across the province increased from last year.

COVID-19 caused the cancelation of the in person November Swap Shop for the past two seasons. The Board decided that we would NOT attempt a Swap Shop in November 2022. The lack of ski equipment is a determining factor. It was felt that a valuable fundraiser for CCSAM would be damaged now and in the future by a lack of inventory.

Our provincial Sport funding remained constant.

With the help of Sport Manitoba we have accessed all available Federal / Provincial / COVID funding. I have to mention the tremendous support CCSAM gets from Sport Manitoba over the years. I participate in monthly Nordiq Canada conference calls among all the provinces and territories. CCSAM continues to be the envy of other provinces when it comes to Covid briefings and guidance with Return to Play Protocols.

The upcoming 2022 – 2023 ski season in Manitoba will continue to look different.

COVID has not disappeared. The priority will always be: Keep our people safe. (Coaches/Officials/Volunteers/Athletes/Spectators/Family members)

Last year CCSAM developed a 2021-2025 Strategic Plan. A plan to guide us was prepared.

- 1. CCSAM strives to introduce Manitobans to the sport of cross country skiing, providing support and guidance for participants at all levels. In summary
- 2. CCSAM works as a community to identify and train athletes to achieve their highest level of competitive performance.
- 3. CCSAM supports the development of certified coaches, instructors, officials, and volunteers to foster excellence in sport leadership.
- 4. CCSAM demonstrates clear direction and leadership. CCSAM acts strategically to support participation, excellence, community involvement and accessibility to the sport as well as the ability to govern effectively.

More GOOD NEWS: CCSAM has applied to the Province of Manitoba in the amount of \$300,000 for a Small Capital and Special Initiatives Project Grant. These funds will be put towards a new Starter Instructor Building. Additional funding will be sought from Foundations, and other levels of government. This project is one of the last major projects that Brent Bottomley envisioned in his 2012 proposal to the City of Winnipeg.
